


IBMA ANNOUNCES 2021 INDUCTEES TO THE BLUEGRASS MUSIC HALL OF FAME:

Nashville, TN, July 20, 2021 – One of the most acclaimed artists in the history of bluegrass, Alison **Krauss**, trailblazing bandleader/banjoist Lynn Morris, and early bluegrass influencers the **Stoneman Family** were announced as the 2021 inductees into the Bluegrass Music Hall of Fame.

FOX SONGS AND OTHER TALES FROM THE PANDEMIC



Andy Thorn Fox Songs and Other Tales from the Pandemic

"Home is where we shelter out the storm, and home is where the fire keeps us warm," sings **Leftover Salmon** banjo-picker **Andy Thorn** on the opening track from his new solo release, an album crafted during the dark days of a growing worldwide pandemic and a gentle rumination on life.

When the world shut down and cancelled all the shows. Thorn found himself home with nowhere to go. He also soon found himself with a new child on the way. Inspired by a fox who made his home near Thorn's house and who would visit daily, Thorn and his wife Cecelia began writing songs together, recording them in a home studio constructed in their Thorn played all the basement. instruments on the album, with additional vocals from his wife.

For Thorn stepping outside of his comfort zone musically, and tackling both the bass and drum parts that adorn the album, helped create a record delivered with a simple innocence where each song sounds instantly like an old friend.

Shannon Bielski & Moonlight Drive *Tennessee Heart*


Some albums grab a listener's attention from the get-go and don't let up. Sometimes, in a first listen of a CD, you just know "this is something special." *Tennessee Heart*, the debut from **Shannon Bielski** & Moonlight Drive checks both of those boxes and then some.

Bielski and her band won the 2018 Mid-Atlantic Bluegrass Competition and Bielski took first place that same year in the Deer Creek Fiddler's Convention Songwriting Contest. She put those skills to good use on Tennessee Heart, opening the album with the heartfelt title track.

Banjo player **Rob Benzing** has two nifty original instrumentals that showcase some tight picking all the way around, from Bielski's fiddle to **Kyle Windbeck**'s mandolin and **Greg Mulley** on

bass. Bielski's vocals are strong out in front of this progressive band, but she's not just using that great voice, it is backed by her strong writing and the authentic feel this band produces.
