Ola Belle Campbell Reed (1915-2002) was an American mountain music matriarch whose music, singing and songwriting has influenced Del McCoury, Tim O'Brien, Marty Stuart, and many others who have all recorded and performed her material. Her skills with claw-hammer banjo and song writing are exceptional.

Ola Belle Reed hales from the mountains of northwestern North Carolina where she learned to pick the banjo at an early age and began writing songs about her life in the mountains. Ola Belle has written over two hundred songs, including, "High on a Mountain", "I've Endured", "Undone in Sorrow", and "The Leading Role". She is the recipient of the National

For a long time, Arthur Campbell was able to support his family with earnings as a schoolteacher and by maintaining a farm in the New River Valley. Unfortunately, the Great Depression took its toll and in the late 1930's the Campbell family, like many other people from the Appalachia area, moved to northeastern Maryland in search of good farmland and better employment opportunities.

She continued to play her music in the Maryland, Pennsylvania, and Delaware region. She joined a band called the North Carolina Ridge Runners. Their mountain music was



received very well, especially by the many former mountain people who had moved to the region. She was good enough to be offered a chance to join Roy Acuff's Smokey Mountain Boys in 1945, but she declined the offer.

In 1949 she married Bud Reed. who also came from a musical family. The following year they started Rainbow Park in Lancaster, Pennsylvania just north of the Mason-Dixon line. The couple then opened New River Ranch in Rising Sun, Maryland, in partnership with Ola Belle's brother, Alex Campbell. She organized a band called the New River Boys to play there and at other country music parks throughout the region. The New River Ranch became a major country music venue, and hosted shows by George Jones, the Louvin Brothers, Ralph Stanley, Bill Monroe, June Carter and Johnny Cash, Ernest Tubb, and numerous others. The venue gave these stars a chance to play their music on Sunday afternoon before appreciative crowds. Many residents in Maryland, Pennsylvania, and Delaware had moved from the south during the War years and were glad to have a chance to hear their type of music.

She appeared in a Public Television tribute to G. B. Grayson, one half of the Grayson and Whitter band which was well-known and recorded a number of songs which have become bluegrass standards.

Her father would sometimes play with G. B. Grayson, who lived in the area, although he did not play with Grayson and Whitter. She called Grayson by Bammon, his middle name, although he used his initials G. B on his records. In the tribute, she played three of his songs.

She accompanied herself by playing clawhammer banjo tuned in "Reuben tuning" (1st string-D, 2nd string-A, 3<sup>rd</sup> string-F<sup>#,</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> string-D, 5<sup>th</sup> string F<sup>#</sup>). Her husband sang "The Wreck of Old 97," which was recorded by Grayson's partner Henry Whitter, and of course by numerous others since, including Johnny Cash. She also told stories about each of the songs she sang. "I've Always Been a Rambler" told about travel when modern means of transportation were unavailable, and it was considered an extremely long trip to go from North Carolina through Marion (not Maryland) to Johnson City. "Train 45/Reuben's Train" said may have been written by Grayson, and portrayed the train climbing the mountains near Lansing, the nearest railroad station to the Grassy Creek community. She said that "My Donnie Where You Been So Long" has a number of different variations and

different titles. She said that in studying Grayson's legacy, it was extremely important to consider not only his music but also his lifestyle, personality, and philosophy.

She stated that she was proud of her heritage, she had gone barefoot as a child and was proud of it, and

times of need. They lacked the modern "pushbutton" conveniences, but they didn't miss them because they didn't know about them. She said that she had lived near Grayson's late son and his wife and was proud that she had recently met his grandson. Ola Belle Reed's best-known songs are "High on a Mountain," "Undone in Sorrow," and the autobiographical "I've Endured."

She wrote many other songs as well and performed her songs and other "old time" songs frequently for many years. She had a stroke in 1987 and did not perform after that. She died on August 16, 2002. While she is no longer with us, her songs live on, but as she said, we should remember her for her lifestyle, personality, and philosophy as well as for her music.



## Galax's Old Fiddler's Convention By: Kara Rae McConville

"There's a bluebird singin' in the Blue Ridge Mountains calling me back to my home..."



I grew up in the heart of southwestern Virginia in a small town called Galax. Galax is home to The Old Fiddlers Convention, the super bowl of them all!

This fiddlers convention originated in 1935 and is run by Moose Lodge #733. It has all the characteristics, beverages, and even some of the landmarks we sing about in our circles. The unincorporated community (and creek) of Cripple Creek is about 30 minutes "as the crow flies". Mayberry (or Mount Airy, NC) is 30 minutes south, home to Andy Griffith and The Darlin's. Though The Dillards are from Missouri, with their stage name, *The Darlin's*, they sang on the Andy Griffith Show based off Mount Airy. (I bet we can all name a tune sang by The Darlin's!)

Other legends from the area are Ralph Stanley, Doc Watson, Tony Rice, Wayne Henderson, the list goes on. Galax itself holds its own fame - The Old Fiddler's Convention is a stop on "The Crooked Road: Virginia's Heritage Music Trail". Another stop on the Crooked Road is radio station 98.1 WBRF which holds a live show featuring Bluegrass and Old-Time bands every Friday night at the Rex Theater. Another is the latest addition, the Blue Ridge Music Center on the Blue Ridge Parkway. (I highly recommend checking out the Crooked Road. thecrookedroadva.com/)

The setting of the convention is in **Felts Park**, with a stadium and stage that sits there year-round waiting for the second week in

August. Hundreds of people travel from near and far with their instruments, to camp, to see and be seen, to hear and be heard.

The instruments vary from kazoos (annual kazoo parade) to a bass and every Bluegrass and Old-Time instrument in between.

Cloggers can be seen walking around with a piece of plywood ready to drop and join in.

Jams happen throughout the campground at campers, tents, middle of the walkway...

Everyone is always so welcoming. Stay and play for a song or make friends and play until dawn. They never turn the lights off.

The competition on the stage is fun to sit in the grandstands and watch. Individuals and bands compete in the various Bluegrass and Old-Time categories each night. This year my dad, Joe Hawks, and I both competed in Bluegrass Banjo and backed each other up on guitar. A tradition we have been doing off and on and sometimes together since 1994. (Or at least that's how far the ribbons go back.) Dad has been attending since 1965. For many years I only came to listen but every year I'd leave with the desire to learn to play and join in someday. The first year I competed, I was 16. I had no idea what I was doing. I played a washtub bass made with a washtub and plywood.

Dad has a funny game of not telling me what he's going to play until its almost time to walk on stage. "Just play a G the whole time, listen for the D. You'll be fine," he'd say. I was so nervous it took me several years to work up the courage to try again, next with guitar.

The desire to learn and play Bluegrass was in my blood and I never could shake it but outside of Galax, I had nowhere to learn. Then I moved to Marietta, GA, and it's only been in the last 3-4 years that I discovered SEBA through at Bluegrass workshop with

Jim Adkins and have been able to jam somewhat regularly. I'm so grateful for this community and it has been a joy to learn from some talented, very patient, people here. SEBA friends are like family.

My dad has become a luthier in his retirement, and I've had the opportunity to make several instruments with him. Dad is good friends with Wayne Henderson a renown luthier from Rugby, VA, and this year we had 4 of Wayne's instruments together at one jam. (Thanks to Bill Reynolds for the picture.) Wayne was at Galax this year, I'm sure he played somewhere, but we only saw him playing cornhole. Haha!

This year we had the pleasure of welcoming Hunter Berry, the fiddle player for Rhonda Vincent to our campsite. (I can assure you, I only listened to that jam.)

The Old Fiddler's Convention is dedicated to "Keeping alive the memories and sentiments of days gone by and make it possible for people of today to hear and enjoy the tunes of yesterday"

The group is made up of founder Painter Dickson Lester, mandolin/guitar player Ron Levine, banjo player Ronnie Futral, and bass/guitar player Steelman Borden.

The band members have changed & continued to use the group to play for retirement homes and many other special events in the community around Cobb County, various Georgia, Florida & Kansas venues including SEBA's Annual Bluegrass Festivals, the Bear On The Square (Dahlonega) Bluegrass festivals, SEBA's Annual Blairsville festivals, Acworth, Kennesaw, Dallas, Cartersville and many other locations.

They have helped with countless fundraisers for Churches, the Kenya Connection Ministries International, Living Hope Ministries, Precious Pearls Ministries, "Herb Emory's Toys For Tots" annual Fundraiser With The Marines at Fred's Family BBQ House on HWY 278 next door to the Harley Davidson Dealership, Little General historic Civil War Train Museum with the Smithsonian Museum, Panorama Apple Festival and many others.




